Signage for hygiene.</p> <p>Please see the clubhouse risk assessment for their guidelines.</p>	1	4	4

4	E, C, TP, MP, V	During, training and match play when applicable	4	4	16	<p>Spectator groups are not permitted as per the current FA government guidelines.</p> <p>Players should arrive on site already changed and ready to take part.</p> <p>No changing facilities will be available.</p> <p>All participants to bring their own drinks and refreshments, kept in their own possession and ideally named.</p> <p>Competitive training can take place in an outdoor setting in groups of no more than 30 including coaches - Social distancing guidelines apply.</p> <p>All persons entering/leaving site should sanitise their hands.</p> <p>No spitting, avoid shouting or raising voices in line with COVID-19 code of behaviour.</p> <p>You must clean and disinfect all equipment before, during and after matches and training.</p> <p>Equipment should not be shared, and goalkeepers should ensure they disinfect their gloves regularly in breaks in training or matches and thoroughly afterwards.</p> <p>Where possible, coaches should only handle equipment in training.</p> <p>Injuries can be treated, disposable gloves and PPE to be worn to limit any risk disposed of safely.</p> <p>When the ball goes out of play it should not be retrieved by non participants and where possible by using feet rather than hands.</p> <p>Set players are encouraged to avoid unnecessarily long set up or close markings.</p> <p>Goal celebrations are discouraged and kept up to date with the government guidelines.</p> <p>Youth football coaches are encouraged to limit persistent close proximity of participants during match play and training.</p>	1	4	4
